Stanislava Walasiewicz (1911-1980), known in America as Stella Walsh, was one of the biggest stars of women's athletics in the world between the wars. She was a female athlete, capable of almost single-handedly winning against the national teams of more than one country. From her first start on Polish soil, she won the hearts of fans, demonstrating a class superior to anything yet seen in Poland in short runs, jumps and even throws.
